## How do I practise dietetics legally in New Zealand?



## You MUST be both REGISTERED and HOLD AN ANNUAL PRACTISING CERTIFICATE (APC) to practise legally in New Zealand.

Registration is usually a oncein-a-lifetime process. Your APC is valid for a maximum of one year and must be renewed annually.

Are you working within the Scope of Practice: Dietitian and using your dietetic skills and knowledge in your employment or voluntary work?

If **NO**, you do NOT need an APC but *must* make an annual non-practising declaration to remain on the Register

If **YES**, then you are legally entitled to call yourself a Dietitian and to practise as such in New Zealand

If **NO**, please contact the Board's office urgently, because you could be in breach of your obligations as a registered health practitioner under the HPCA Act 2003

How do I apply for an Annual Practising Certificate?

Annual Practising Certificate (APC) declarations are completed online via the Dietitians Login. If it is your first time logging in, you will need to follow the prompts to 'activate' your account.

## Making a declaration for an APC:

 First APC – Following Registration you can do this at any time of the year within the prescribed timeframe – see the 'Deadlines for Registration/First APC' policy on the Boards website

- APC Renewal You do this between 1 and 31 March every year for the following practising year (practising year runs from 1 April – 31 March)
- Returning to Practice within 2
  years of holding an APC You can
  change your practising status and
  make a new practising declaration at
  any time of the year
- Returning to Practice after declaring Non-Practising for 2 years or more – Before you change your practising status and make a new

Are you registered with the Dietitians Board?

I am not registered

It is illegal to call yourself a Dietitian in New Zealand, or to imply that you are one, if you are not registered.

You **MUST** apply for Registration if you wish to work within the *Scope of Practice: Dietitian*, or call yourself, a Dietitian.

- Master of Science (Nutrition and Dietetics) from Massey University
